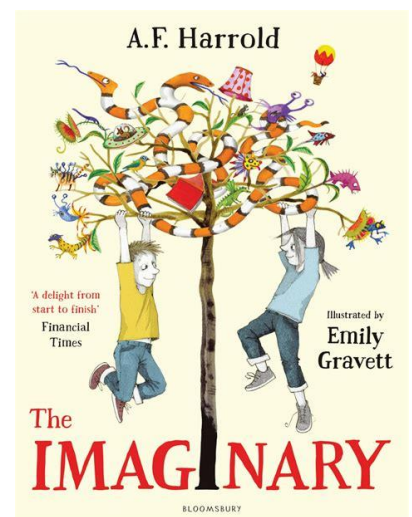


In term 3, we have been investigating the question: 'How do we hear sounds?' We carried out a range of experiments as part of the Enquiry. Through the experiments, we learnt that sound is created when vibrations travel through the air - these vibrations are called soundwaves. To investigate the pitch of a sound, we used boom whackers. Each boom whacker made a different sound depending on the size of the tube. The large boom whackers made a low pitch sound and the small boom whackers made a high pitch sound. This is because the vibrations of the small boom whacker are much faster. For our challenge, we created a sound documentary. Using all of the knowledge we had learnt throughout the Topic, we wrote detailed scripts in groups. We practised performing the scripts in a documentary style then recorded them. We shared these documentaries with our families for our 'celebration of learning' afternoon.

In English, we have been reading 'The Imaginary' and writing a fantasy tale. For the wow, we sketched our imaginary friends and then visited Chelsea Park to play with them! Using the book as inspiration, we worked towards writing a fantasy tale. Our final fantasy tale was about an adventure we had taken with our imaginary friends.



In maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division. We have learnt how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000. We have also learnt the formal written method to help us solve tricky multiplication problems. For division, we used concrete methods to understand dividing is sharing equally. We learnt the short division method to help us with challenging division problems.
